Why value education in schools of Goa?

Development of values in children can develop their personality. It can improve their quality of life by studying this subject of value education in schools. Value education classes can pave the way for a society where true and lasting values are cherished, upheld and lived. A value education class is to be systematically organized to enable the child / individual to discover, choose, internalize and actually practice and live by the values that are taught/presented in the form of stories, power points, films & scenes etc.

It is said that values cannot be taught it has to be caught by watching others, the reason is because when we talk about the VALUES in children it should come in due course of time with experience, with interactions, during the course of play or learning etc. These life experiences help to bring about an improvement in the child's thoughts, ideas, attitudes, interests emotions, sentiments, personality and character. In fact, Value Education influences all aspects of a child's growth and development. It should be the part of educational process. A teacher can make the value education classes more attractive by presenting before the children variety of stories, parables, mythological stories, video clippings, short films etc.

Over the years this need has been repeatedly emphasized by different Education commissions.

RADHAKRISHNAN COMMISSION (1948): "If we exclude value education in our institutions, we would be untrue to our whole historical development."

SRI PRAKASA COMMITTEESRI PRAKASA COMMITTEE ON RELIGIOUS A ON RELIGIOUS AND MORAL INSTRUCTION:

"Every effort must therefore be made to teach students true moral values from the earliest stages of their educational life."

KOTHARI COMMISSION (1964-66): "A serious defect in the school system is the absence of provision for education in social, moral and spiritual values".

NATIONAL POLICY ON EDUCATION (1986): "The growing concern over the erosion of essential values and an increasing cynicism in society has brought to focus the need for readjustments in the curriculum, in order to make education a forceful tool for the cultivation of social and moral values."

THE PROGRAMM OF ACTION N.P.E. (1992) has also emphasized value education as an integral part of the school curriculum.

NEW EDUCATION POLICY 2020: Has also emphasized moral ethical and skill development holistic education for all.

SIGNIFICANCE: In a world where moral and social values are rapidly disintegrating, where power and knowledge are being misused for vested interests, where nations no longer trust each other and where indiscipline, corruption and violence are the order of the day, the need for imparting value education has been more needed.

Life in the future is going to be even more complex and difficult for our students than it is now. Our students therefore should be trained to make the right choices and the right decisions, when faced with conflicting situations. Therefore a program of value education can best succeed in equipping our students of today with the knowledge, skills and attitudes they need, to encounter the future, with courage and confidence. Value education is important the more we face difficulties the greater should be our determination. Value education can give the strength to our children thus it becomes necessary for us to teach this in our schools.

There was a time when people of Goa were staying in a joint family system. As the time changed many people left their villages in search of jobs and settled in cities. As a result nuclear family system increased in Goa. As a result there were no grandparents in most of the families to talk to the children about morals values and to tell them moral stories to help them grow as balance personality.

I believe value education classes could be conducted without the burden of Text Books on the children. Our day to day life experiences can be the best values to present to the children. I believe the famous proverb "Preaching is teaching" because even today

children treat their teachers as the Role Model. Though variety of text books is available a teacher can design a program to provide individuals/teachers/students with a variety of ideas, approaches and techniques that can be utilized by them.

Types of Values

Values have been variously classified. Shaver classifies values as aesthetic, instrumental and moral. Others classify values as social, moral, aesthetic, civic, economic, cultural etc. Still others classify values as personal, community and neighbourly values.

- 1. **Personal Values:** Personal values are those values practice by the individual alone, irrespective of his social relationships.
 - The following are some personal values.

- 2. **Neighbourly Values:** unlike personal values, the practice of neighborly values necessitates the interaction of two or more persons e.g. Patience. Though one can practice patience with oneself, the value is best actualized in the exercise of calmness and tranquility with another or with others.

- 3. **Community Values:** Community values guide the community's vision, mission and strategic plan as well as its goals, objectives, activities, capital projects, budgets and services. It enables us to share personal relatedness and support perpetual growth of each other.

ROLE OF TEACHERS

In teaching and inculcating values, the teachers have a great role to play.

- 1. A teacher has to be a facilitator to stimulate, provoke, inform and sanitizes the learners with reference to value situations in life.
- 2. Through involving the learners actively in group discussion and practical activities teacher should make them think and reflect on human actions.

- 3. Teacher should able to create an atmosphere of love, trust, cooperation and security in the school conducive to the development of high ideals and values.
- 4. They should talk of things students are interested in. students interest comes first even if these interests seem strange to you.
- 5. Teachers should cultivate variety in teaching values don't repeat the same way of doing things.
- 6. They carry out their professional obligations in accordance with the highest standards and ethics of teaching profession.
- 7. The institutional process in the training institution should help teachers acquire these capabilities by providing concrete situations and opportunities and actively involve them in appropriate learning experiences.
- 8. They should develop a nationalistic feeling among students.
- 9. Create awareness about the problem of future especially those related to environment, food, water, pollution, health and population.
- 10. Give equal importance to all students irrespective of caste, creed, gender and money.

Value education is an important aspect of education affecting the students and the society as a whole. Therefore it is important to teach this subject with great enthusiasm by the teachers. Some educators tend to take lightly the proper growth of students as result students do not understand the importance of value system. Though it is a fact that values are caught more than taught, it is important to make students grow up in an atmosphere of well being which is possible through value education.




found a lovely, leather-bound Holy Book, angrily, he raised his voice at his father and said,

arrangements to visit his father, he received a telegram telling him his father had passed away, and willed all of his possessions to his son. He needed to come home immediately and take care of things.


When he arrived at his father's house, sudden sadness and regret filled his heart, he began to search his father's important papers and saw the still new Holy Book, just as he had left it years ago.

- God has placed around us many people who love us and want to help us. We call them guides they can be our teachers, parents counselors or could be any one in whom we have confidence to help us.


Can all become a good guide?

STEPS TO IMPROVE TIME MANAGEMENT

- a. Goal Setting
- b. Prioritization
- c. Managing Interruptions
- d. Scheduling
 - a. GOAL SETTING: To start managing time effectively, you need to set goals. When you know where you are going, you can then figure out what exactly needs to be done and in what order.
 - b. PRIORITIZATION: Prioritizing what needs to be done is especially important. Without it, you may work very hard but you won't be achieving the results you desire because what you are working on is not of strategic importance. Make a to-do list with most important work first and the least important work at last.
 - c. MANAGING INTERRUPTIONS: Having plan and knowing what to do the next is how to stop interruptions that one has to face during the day. For example how to manage phone calls one way would be to be prompt and give to the point reply. However interruptions are a natural and necessary part of life. Here you do what you sensibly can to minimize it.

d. **SCHEDULING:** When you know what your goals and priority tasks that you have to complete you can work comfortably by setting the required timetable.

Conclusion

Time management is an essential skill that helps you keep your work under control, at the same time that it helps you keep stress to minimum.
